## What is a Certified Family Home?

A Certified Family Home (CFH) provides a safe, family-style living environment for adults with developmental disabilities who need some assistance with daily living activities. Usually there are one or two adults residing in a Certified Family Home.

Each resident has a care plan designed to meet their individual needs and to ensure they have the opportunity to participate in community activities.

The Certified Family Home is operated by a provider who has been certified by the Department of Health and Welfare and demonstrates the knowledge and experience to provide a safe and effective service to the resident(s).



## What services are available through Program Coordination?

- Development of program implementation plans designed to meet each resident's needs
- Initial and ongoing training related to implementing programs in the home
- Annual face to face meetings with providers and participants in the home
- Ongoing contact with providers to review program implementation plans and progress
- Creation of alone time, safety and behavior program implementation plans as needed
- Information on community training and resources
- Reporting issues of adult abuse, neglect, and exploitation
- Reporting of other health and safety, certification, and compliance issues

## What is a Program Coordinator (PC)?

Program Coordinators offer a person-centered approach to assist the Certified Family Homes in developing implementation plans designed to meet each resident's needs. Program Coordinators develop written programs to be implemented in the home by the Certified Family Home provider and provide one-on-one trainings to assist with these programs to enhance independent living skills for the resident.
